Switzerland

Switzerland is a small country with a population of 8.9 million people. It has 4 language regions and 26 cantons, which are largely independent and consist of numerous local authorities or communes. Multilingualism and federalism have their roots in the past, yet still shape Switzerland today. Its neutrality is recognised by all states of the world.

26 cantons



- 4 languages (G, F, I, R)
- Direct Democracy
- Area: around 41,285 km²
- About 27 % of residents are foreign nationals without a Swiss passport.
- ▶ 18.7% of people aged 65 and over
- Most common diseases: cardiovascular diseases (e.g., ischemic heart disease), depression and dementia.
- Roughly 4.4 doctors/1,000 inhabitants
- Nurses: approximately 7.9 /1,000 inhabitants. Total nursing staff: 16.1/1,000 inhabit.
- Nurses in Community Care: 1.2 per 1.000 inhabitants. Total nursing staff: 2.5/1,000 inhab.



(Scope: BAG Care services)

Scope and content of care

- ▶ A doctor orders that the patient requires care services
- A nurse from the Spitex organisation determines the necessary care services on the basis of a needs assessment with the patient and/or their relatives
- The needs assessment is signed by the general practitioners
- ► The needs assessment is checked by the health insurance company and care treatments may have to be adjusted accordingly
- Spitex carries out the care services and will follow the care plan
- Care planning is continuously adapted to the patient's current needs within the specified scope of care
