




Psychiatric hospital beds per 100 000









Number of psychiatrists per 100000












DAY CARE CENTRES IN CR 2001



DIAGNOSTIC STRUCTURE IN INDIVIDUAL DC CENTRES




European Evaluation of Coercion in Psychiatry

COERCIVE MEASURES IN INDIVIDUAL STUDY SITES






EUNOMIA FORCED MEDICATION IN INDIVIDUAL CENTRES













STIGMA OF PSYCHIATRY ČR 1999, representative sample of 1248 respondents




Náklady na péči poskytnutou v oboru psychiatrie v letech 2000 – 2007




